



In Germany, more than 130.000 children a year witness the divorce or separation of their parents. The right of every child to have direct contact with both parents is an essential part of a child's wellbeing, according to German family law and the UN-Convention on the Rights of the Child art. 9. For children of separated or divorced parents the legal claim often turns into a mere theoretic scheme once the parents live in different places. Many children in Germany grow up as half-orphans because the non-resident parent lacks the financial means to cover the regular monthly expenses for travel and accommodation. Our initiative alleviates the financial burden and makes sure that children stay connected with both parents, regardless of the geographic distance or the financial situation.

Our initiative aims to help non-resident fathers and mothers by providing the following support services:

- ✓ **free accommodation provided by volunteering private hosts** at the child's place of residence and across Germany. Regular and reliable contact of the non-resident parent with the child, despite the geographical distance and the financial constraints.
- ✓ **free temporary playrooms** in private homes, nursery schools and family centres, where children can spend quality time with their visiting moms or dads in a consumption-free environment - almost like at home!
- ✓ our **parent counselling** for non-resident parents offers a range of pedagogic impulses and hands-on advice and professional coaching.
